The mission of Gratitude Generation is to instill gratitude in future generations through education and service. The organization has created a platform where children receive an education about the social needs of the world at large, down to the local community by providing an opportunity to serve and improve the lives of at-risk populations. Programs feature opportunities to collect donations, fundraise, perform random acts of kindness and participate in face-to-face service where kids see and feel the impact of their giving. Gratitude Generation also implements educational seminars, elementary-school curriculum and hosts six to nine service events each month. In the past year, more than 10,600 people have been impacted by a program by either participating in it or directly benefiting from it.

"When the five of us founding Board members set out to build Gratitude Generation, we knew our communities would embrace us.
